The following Ordinance was offered by C.C. Fuller who moved its adoption.

ORDINANCE No. 157

AN ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Mayor of the TOWN OF DUBACH, Louisiana, hereinafter called "Municipality", to enter into an Agreement with Louisiana Power & Light Company for the supply of electric service for the operation of ~~street lighting, water pumping, sewerage pumping, and other municipal services~~

of said Municipality for the term provided therein, and to provide for the payment of the amount due under said Agreement.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Town council of the TOWN OF DUBACH, Louisiana, in lawful session convened, that the Mayor, R.N. Enloe, be and he is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to enter into an Agreement with Louisiana Power & Light Company, its successors and assigns, for supplying the ~~TOWN OF DUBACH~~ with electric power and energy for the operation of ~~street lighting, water pumping, sewerage pumping, and other municipal services~~

as set out in the attached Agreement, copy of which Agreement is made part hereof and considered as incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the Mayor and/or such other officers or persons for and on behalf of the Municipality be and they are hereby authorized and directed to make all payments to become due under said Agreement in accordance with the conditions thereof during the entire term of said Agreement without further action by the Mayor and town council.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that this Ordinance being necessary to the public health and safety and public welfare and convenience requiring it, shall take effect from and after the date of its adoption.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that all ordinances, actions or parts thereof, in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed, it being the intent of the Mayor and town council that this Ordinance and Agreement made part hereof supersede all existing agreements and contracts now in effect which in any way conflict with the matters herein agreed upon.

WHEREUPON, in open session said Ordinance and Agreement were read and considered section by section and as a whole.

Mr. S.S. Tatum seconded the motion to adopt the Ordinance.

The Mayor then ordered a vote of the yeas and nays on its final passage, and upon roll call such votes were as follows:

ORDINANCE NO.157

AN ORDINANCE, LEVYING AND IMPOSING TAXES ON ALL PROPERTY SUBJECT TO TAXATION IN THE TOWN OF DUBACH, STATE OF LOUISIANA FOR THE YEAR 1982..

SECTION I: BE ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMAN OF THE TOWN OF DUBACH, acting as the governing authority of said Town, that a tax of fourteen Point Two (14.2) Mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all the taxable property in The Town Of Dubach, Louisiana, is hereby levied, assessed and imposed on all said property for the year 1982, three and one-half (3½) Mills for the purpose of paying the principal of an interest on Public Improvement Bonds; and three and one-half (3½) Mills for Water-Works Improvement Bonds, and Seven Point two (7.2) Mills imposed on said property for the year 1982 for the purpose of General Maintenance of the Town Of Dubach, Louisiana.

SECTION II; BE FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the proper administrative officers of the Town Of Dubach, Louisiana be and they are hereby empowered, authorized and directed to spread said taxes, as herein above set forth upon the assesment roll of said Town for the year 1982 and to make collection of the taxes for and on behalf of said Town according to law, and that the taxes herein levied shall become a permanent lien and privilege on all property subject to taxation as herein set forth, and the collection there of shall be enforceable in the manner provided by law.

SECTION III; BE IT FUTHERMORE ORDAINED, etc., that this Ordinance shall be published in the official minutes of the Mayor and Board Of Alderman in the manner provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE Enacting and Defining Laws and Penalties for disturbing the Peace in the TOWN OF DUBACH, LOUISIANA.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for the Town of Dubach, Louisiana, in regular session convened:

DEFINITION: Disturbing the peace is the doing of any of the following in such manner as would foreseeably disturb or alarm the public:

- SECTION 1. Engaging in a fistic encounter,
- SECTION 2. Using of any unnecessarily loud, offensive, obscene or insulting language,
- SECTION 3. Appearing in an intoxicated condition,
- SECTION 4. Engaging in any act in a violent and tumultous manner by any three or more persons,
- SECTION 5. Holding of an unlawful assembly,
- SECTION 6. Interruption of any lawful assembly of people;
- SECTION 7. Commission of any other act in such a manner as to unreasonably disturb or alarm the public,
- SECTION 8. Insults or makes rude or obscene remarks or gestures, or uses profane language or physical acts, or indecent proposals to or toward another or others, or disturbs or obstructs or interferes with another or others,
- SECTION 9. Whoever commits the crime of disturbing the peace shall be fined not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or confined for not more than Thirty (30) Days in jail or work on the streets, or both.
