ORDINANCE # 27

AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING THE HOURS, WHEN BATHING IS PERMITTED, APPROVED SUITS, INDECENT CONDUCT, CHARGES FOR BATHING, THROWING OR OTHERWISE PUTTING ANY BRICK, STONES, STICKS, DIRT, GRASS OR ANY OTHER THING WHATSOEVER IN THE WATER OF SWIMMING POOL, AND FIXING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

SECTION 1 BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the Board of Councilmen of the town of Dubach at regular session convened:

SECTION 2 It shall be unlawful to enter or bath in the pool at any other hours in the day or night than from 6 o'clock A. M. ~~to 10 o'clock A. M. and from 3 o'clock P. M. to 10 o'clock P. M.~~

SECTION 3 It shall be unlawful to enter the water for bathing purposes attired otherwise than in an approved bathing suit.

SECTION 4 No nude bathing shall be permitted.

SECTION 5 No indecent conduct shall be permitted.

SECTION 6 Charges for bathing shall be as follows: One (\$1.00) Dollar season ticket per family, 5¢ per single bath, each ticket good for one entry only.

SECTION 7 It shall be unlawful to throw or otherwise put any brick, stones, sticks, dirt, grass or any other object whatsoever in the water of said swimming pool.

SECTION 8 It is further ordained that the violation of any section of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor and the person guilty thereof upon conviction shall be fined not more than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and costs and in lieu of payment thereof shall serve ten days on the streets of the town of Dubach.

SECTION 9 Be it further ordained that this ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon passage as same is an emergency and hereby classed as such ordinance and is considered by said Mayor and town Councilmen to be necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, and safety of the citizens thereof.

The above ordinance after being read section by section and considered section by section and voted on section by section and voted on as a whole was adopted by the following vote:

Those voting in favor of the ordinance were: O. L. White, R. W. Henry, S. L. Fuller, J. L. Smith.

Those voting against the ordinance were: None. And the ordinance was carried.
