An Ordinance to limit any single expenditures, except for the day to day business, by the Mayor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the Town of Dubach, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of said Town that:

SECTION 1. It is in the best interest of the Town of Dubach to limit any single expenditure, except for the day to day business, by the Mayor for the orderly business outside of normal day to day management and operation of the Town of Dubach as set forth in the Lawrason Act.

SECTION 2. Expenditures in the amount over \$500, shall be presented to the town council for approval.

SECTION 3. Expenditures that meet the requirements of the Louisiana Bid Law shall not be subject to this Ordinance.
